Keeping families close

Board Chair and CEO Message

Every day, families with a seriously ill or injured child rely on us to help ease their burden and provide wrap-around support during the most challenging time of their lives. Together we're making a real difference in the lives of families in need.

As we reflect on another year of helping to keep families close, we're immensely humbled by our dedicated supporters, staff and volunteers and their commitment to supporting Northern NSW families in need. Together, we helped more than 5,000 individual families in 2023 stay together and close to the medical care they require – relieving the financial and emotional burdens that inevitably come when a child is diagnosed with a serious illness or injury.

2023 marked a significant milestone for our Ronald McDonald House in Tamworth – celebrating 15 years of helping regional families with a new baby, seriously ill or injured child. Renovations of the bathrooms within the House also commenced, ensuring families and visitors have access to the best quality facilities possible.

Two cabins at our Ronald McDonald Family Retreat in Forster received kitchen and bathroom upgrades; made possible thanks to the generosity of local trades and companies who donated their time and materials to ensure families holidaying with us have access to beautiful spaces where they can make happy, long-lasting memories.

Refurbishments at our Newcastle Ronald McDonald House also got underway, with Unit 2 on track to be transformed into an accessible unit and a full make-over of Unit 1, improving the comfort and experience of the families we serve.

In 2023, we welcomed over 4,000 different families through our Ronald McDonald Family Room doors – offering them a safe, homelike space to take a much-needed break away from the hospital ward. It was also a significant year for our Newcastle J1 Family Room, celebrating its 20th Anniversary, and our Gosford Family Room, which celebrated 10 years of supporting families.

Our Learning Program continues to make a real difference. We're seeing students gain confidence and unlock their full potential. Thanks to the dedicated support of our amazing tutors, students who have missed school due to serious illness are catching up and thriving in their learning journey.

The impact we made in 2023 would not have been possible without the ongoing support from our generous donors, community groups, volunteers and individuals – donating their time and funding to help deliver vital programs to our families.

We are incredibly thankful for your ongoing support and contributions and look forward to seeing what we can achieve together for families in need for years to come.

About Us

When a child is seriously ill, it can disrupt every aspect of family life – from school and work, to everyday moments like meal times, bath times, play times and quality time. This can have a devastating effect on the whole family. Ronald McDonald House Charities® Northern NSW helps family life carry on while a child is undergoing treatment. Since 1991, we've helped thousands of families through their most difficult times.

Our Mission

To support the ever-changing needs of seriously ill children and their families.

Our Vision

To achieve the best outcome for families by reducing the impact of their child's serious illness.



How We Help

For over 30 years, we've been helping families with a seriously ill or injured child stay together and close to the medical care they need. We've developed vital programs to help them enjoy more everyday family moments, right when they need them most.



2 Houses

Our Houses offer families a place to stay close to the hospital. They're especially helpful for families who need to travel far from home to receive treatment for their child. Each House is equipped with everything families need to feel supported during their stay.



1 Family Retreat

Our Family Retreat gives families a chance to forget the stresses of hospital life. They're open to families with a seriously ill child, or those grieving the loss of a child.



3 Family Rooms

Our Family Rooms are located inside major hospitals and close to the children's wards. They give families a chance to recharge after many stressful hours at their child's side. Each Family Room is equipped with areas to rest, eat, freshen up, play, and relax.



Learning Program

Extended stays in hospital or receiving medical treatment means kids miss school. Our tailored one-to-one tuition helps kids catch up on schoolwork so that they feel confident as they transition back to school.

Our Learning Program also offers professional development for educators. EDMed™ provides teachers with information about the potential impacts of a serious or chronic illness, as well as educational strategies to support the needs of these students impacted by a serious or chronic illness.



A 'home away from home' for Lyam

"I don't know where we'd be today if it wasn't for the House."

Seventeen-year-old Lyam has spent most of his life managing his complex medical needs, having been diagnosed with autism at a young age, growing up with limited verballity and other health issues.

In late 2022, Lyam faced yet another hurdle when he was diagnosed with Leukemia and flown from his home in Tamworth to the John Hunter Children's Hospital in Newcastle to start treatment.

"Lyam was doing so well, before becoming really ill all of a sudden. I was in shock. I didn't know what was happening," his mother, Leeann said.

"As soon as I met the staff at the House I felt right at home - without Ronald McDonald House it would have been tough; I don't know where we'd be today if it wasn't for the House."

During his 167-night stay, Lyam quickly became a familiar face at our Ronald McDonald House Newcastle - giving back to the House in his own special way.

Unique Families Supported

5,098 families were helped by staff, volunteers and supporters in 2023.



Ronald McDonald Houses

609 different families given a home away from home for a total of **6,253** nights with an average stay of 10 nights.



Our Volunteers

368 volunteers helped us deliver our mission to support families with sick kids.





Ronald McDonald Family Rooms



4,177 different families took a much needed break in one of our 3 Family Rooms, walking through our doors **10,779** times.

Ronald McDonald Family Retreat



132 holidays were provided for families at our Forster Retreat.

Ronald McDonald Learning Program



180 students received tutoring through the Learning Program. Our Education Liaison Officer worked closely with the Paediatric Oncology team to **support 102 students and their families** on their journey to recovery from serious illness.

Financial Highlights

In 2023, RMHC Northern NSW generated nearly \$6.3 million to support the needs of seriously ill children and their families.

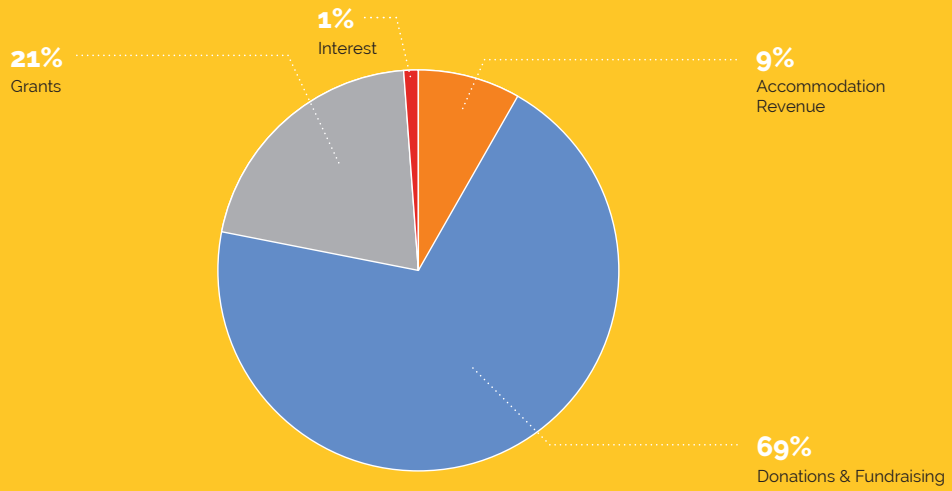

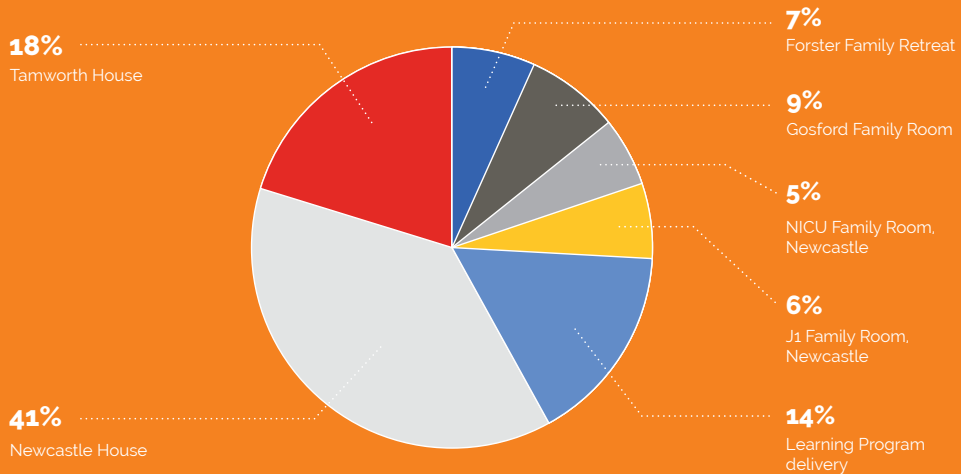

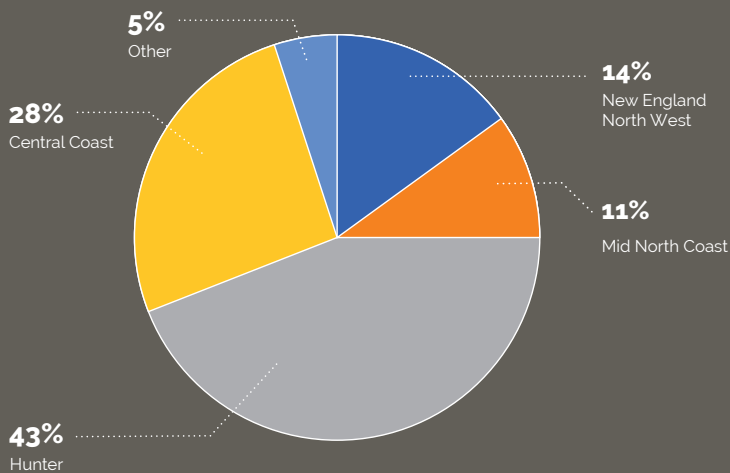

Nine-year-old Matilda is no stranger to doctors and hospitals. Diagnosed with many severe and complex conditions that limit her day-to-day life significantly - including a heart murmur, Noonan's Syndrome and CFC Syndrome - Matilda spends many of her days visiting specialists and medical teams.

So, when Matilda's mum, Melissa, heard about our Ronald McDonald Family Retreat in Forster, she knew it was exactly what their family needed to take a break before Matilda's next big surgery.

Their stay at our Family Retreat was filled with firsts - being the first getaway as a family of four since the birth of Matilda's little sister, Addison, and Matilda's first boat ride, enjoying a cruise down Wallis Lake. The family enjoyed the large outdoor spaces, relaxing on the grass and enjoying time together as a family.

“The House is like a warm hug from Nanna. When we came to House Dinner after spending the day in the NICU, I just sat there crying over it – they were happy tears. It was just like a big hug.”

Four-month-old Sophia's smile lights up any room she's in. Sophia and her parents are familiar faces at our Ronald McDonald House Newcastle and Ronald McDonald Family Room in the John Hunter Children's Hospital, attending to many appointments for Sophia's bilateral cleft lip palette as well as other medical health needs.

“We found out Sophia was going to have a cleft palette lip when I was around 19 weeks pregnant and were told she'd probably have a few more health issues – which she has. We've been coming to Ronald McDonald House since she was born. Every step has been a win so far for us.” Sophia's mum, Emily, said.

When she was born, Sophia spent her first week in the neonatal intensive care unit (NICU). Emily and Sophia's dad, Luke, made use of our Ronald

McDonald Family Room within the NICU. The space allowed them to stay close to Sophia - *“it was one of the best thing. Being in NICU, we couldn't take any food or drink in when we were with Sophia, but we didn't want to be far away from her, so it was really special to have a space that we could take a break in while still being close to her.”*

When asked about their time at our Ronald McDonald House, Luke said *“I don't think words can describe it. When we had our first family dinner here, cooked by the corporate volunteers, Emily was just in tears – overwhelmed by the kindness of everyone and the normality that it brought.”*

Our Community

Ronald McDonald House Charities Northern NSW is 100% community owned and operated. The continued support of businesses, community groups and individuals is key to helping families stay together while their seriously ill children receive vital treatment. Every contribution, big and small, makes a huge difference in the lives of families and helps bring our communities closer together.

Greater Charitable Foundation

Over the past two years of our three-year partnership with the Greater Charitable Foundation, their generous support has helped saved families more than \$886,000. This vital support has significantly alleviated the financial challenges faced by families with sick children, making a meaningful difference in their lives.



Provided a home away from home for 179 families, totaling 1,600 nights, at our Ronald McDonald Houses in Newcastle and Tamworth – saving \$184,000



Funded 3,000 family visits to our Ronald McDonald Family Rooms in Newcastle and Gosford – providing families with a place to unwind and saving \$318,000



Allowed 80 families to enjoy a peaceful getaway at our Ronald McDonald Family Retreat in Forster – saving \$240,000



Provided 1,200 hours of tutoring to assist 30 students through the Ronald McDonald Learning Program – saving over \$144,000



Club Taree



In 2023, Club Taree's signature and much-loved fundraising and community event, 'Le Tour de Taree', raised over \$60,000 for RMHC Northern NSW. Paul Allan (CEO, Club Taree) and the Club Taree team have been committed supporters of RMHC NNSW since 2015, donating nearly \$400,000 to support seriously ill or injured children and their families. Their generosity extends beyond fundraising; with the Club Taree Community Team maintaining an active presence at our Ronald McDonald Family Retreat in Forster hosting monthly Meals from the Heart lunches for the families holidaying with us.

Educational support for students and teachers

After spending a long time in the hospital, a child can find it tough to come back home and get back to school. Adjusting to everyday life, rejoining their classmates, and catching up on everything they missed can feel overwhelming.

The Ronald McDonald Learning Program

The Ronald McDonald Learning Program (RMLP) is available to children from all over the country who have had an extended absence from school due to physical and mental illness.

Emma was diagnosed with Acute Lymphoblastic Leukaemia in July 2022 which took its toll on the whole family. During her treatment she spent lengthy periods in hospital, which impacted everyone in the family, especially her siblings, Will and Belle, who found it hard to concentrate at school when they were worrying about their sister. The Learning Program has been able to support them in catching up, providing tutoring support. Emma completed her therapy in August 2024, but still has a lengthy rehabilitation journey ahead and together with her siblings, will receive support from the Learning Program when she is ready to return to school.

Across Northern NSW the Learning Program supported 180 students, helping them transition back into schooling after their treatment through 1:1 tutoring in the hometown. The program not only helps them academically, but also helps boost confidence and self-esteem.

EDMed

Supporting educators through EDMed professional development continues to positively impact students returning to school. The program provides teachers with information about chronic illness and a range of strategies to support students re-integrating into school, like Emma's. During 2023, 136 educators from schools, universities, and TAFE, were supported, completing the training face-to-face or online.



Our Programs



Highlights from 2023

Houses

In 2023, Ronald McDonald House Tamworth celebrated a major milestone: 15 years of supporting families in New England and North West. Since opening, we have assisted over 2,000 country families. This year, we completed renovations of two out of five bathrooms, transforming them into modern, family-friendly amenities. This achievement was made possible by the generous support of ABI Interiors, NCIA, Haestier Homes, The Lions Club of Tamworth, and The Servies Group – Tamworth.

At Ronald McDonald House Newcastle, renovations of two of the six self-contained units progressed significantly, under the guidance of interior designer Melony from Melony Lea Designs. These upgrades provide a more comfortable environment for families with immunocompromised children during medical treatment. Funding from the Wests Group and nib Foundation has been instrumental, alongside donations of products from Polytec, Armstrong Flooring Australia, National Tiles, and ABI Interiors. Additionally, a major project to

replace a section of the retaining wall was completed with support from Collaborative Construction Solutions.

The ongoing improvements to our Houses create a haven for families when their child is hospitalised, offering all the comforts of home and more.

Family Rooms

Our Family Rooms had lots of reasons to celebrate in 2023 with the J1 Family Room at John Hunter Children's Hospital turning 20 and the Gosford Family Room at Gosford Hospital turning 10. Over that time the Family Rooms have been able to provide local (and not so local) families a sanctuary within the hospital, where a simple cuppa and chat with one of the friendly volunteers can help take away the worry and stress of their child's illness or injury.

"This is such a wonderful space, set up perfectly to make you feel at home during long wait while my child underwent surgery. The volunteers couldn't be more helpful and made us feel at home during stressful time. Thank you so much." Shared by one family who has utilised the Family Room.



Forster Retreat

Our Forster Family Retreat saw exciting upgrades continue in 2023, with renovations to Cabins 1 and 3 aimed at enriching the experience for families, so that every visit is a time for connection and cherished memories.

Thanks to the incredible generosity of our community, who donated goods and services, these upgrades have transformed the Retreat Cabins into modern beach houses equipped with all the amenities families need for a well-deserved getaway.

The Family Retreat offers a welcomed sanctuary for families with sick or injured kids to reconnect, relax and enjoy time together; an experience most of us often take for granted. The continued upgrades help ensure that more families are able to enjoy the benefits of a break and have much-needed time away in a picturesque and peaceful location.

Learning Program

The Learning Program continues to provide flexible learning support helping 180 school aged sick or injured kids to get back on track with their learning. This support is offered to help siblings of seriously ill or injured children, with 10 siblings being supported during the year, providing the whole family with educational supports.

Our Education Liaison Officer also worked closely with the Paediatric Oncology team to support an additional 102 students and their families on their journey to recovery from serious illness.

The In-House School Holiday Program at our Newcastle House brought helped create memorable moments and bring smiles to sick kids faces during school holidays for not only families staying at the House, but also local families being supported by the Learning Program.

Our Events

From golf days to charity balls, luncheons to music gigs, 2023 was filled with many inspiring, fun and love-filled events; connecting Ronald McDonald House Charities Northern NSW with our supportive local communities and coming together to raise funds for seriously ill and injured children and their families.

Charity Golf Days



In 2023, we hosted several Charity Golf Days across the Hunter, New England and Central Coast regions. Our Golf Days are always a fun-filled day on the green, with our golfers enjoying on-course activities and goods kindly donated by our event partners and sponsors. In total, our 2023 Golf Days raised over \$113,000, providing 840 nights of accommodation to Northern NSW families with a seriously ill or injured child.

Raise Love Charity Balls



In 2023 our Raise Love Charity Balls hosted in Gosford and Newcastle alongside our event partners, Robson Civil Projects and Alliance Labour Solutions, welcomed over 720 guests collectively. Guests heard inspiring stories first hand from families that have been supported by our programs and dug deep to raise funds for seriously ill or injured children and their families. We extend a big thank you to our event sponsors and guests whose generosity helped to raise over \$434,148 collectively – equating to over 3,215 nights of accommodation for families in need.

International Women's Day



Our 2023 Mid-North Coast International Women's Day Luncheon was a sell-out event. It was an inspiring day with five local women sharing their stories and experiences with more than 150 guests in attendance – celebrating the incredible women of the region while raising funds for families in need. A big thank you must go to our event partner, Club Taree, who continue to be committed supporters of our Ronald McDonald Family Retreat in Forster.

Country Under the Vines



We were thrilled to welcome 'Country Under the Vines' back for 2023 – hosting a jam-packed music gig as part of Tamworth's Country Music Festival in January. Eleven incredible country music artists filled our line-up, with over 220 people joining us at the Longyard Hotel throughout the day and helping to raise over \$62,000 – equating to more than 250 nights of accommodation for regional families staying at our Ronald McDonald House in Tamworth. Thank you to our Event Partner, Iuso Enterprises, and Event Sponsor, Chris Watson Travel.

CEO Walk in my Shoes

In March we welcomed 8 local CEO's and senior leaders to our Ronald McDonald House in Newcastle to take part in an immersive, 22-hour 'CEO Walk in my Shoes' (CWIMS) experience. The leaders were faced with a scenario that many families with a seriously ill or injured child are faced with – seeing just how beneficial our programs are for families in need and strengthening their understanding and relationship with Ronald McDonald House Charities Northern NSW. For some participants, the CWIMS experience was a way to give back to an organisation that had supported their family in the past.

Our Founding and Forever Mission Partner

Ronald McDonald House Charities values the enduring and close association with our founding and forever Mission Partner, McDonald's. This partnership allows us to continue offering important programs that keep families near the medical care and resources their child needs.

McHappy Day has continued to be the biggest fundraising day of the year for RMCH in Australia for over 30 years. In 2023, McHappy Day raised a record breaking \$6.4 million across Australian McDonald's stores, ensuring the ongoing delivery of RMHC programs across nationally and providing over 40,000 nights of accommodation for seriously ill and injured children and their families.

Locally, McDonald's stores, licensees, managers and crew continue to share their passion and

commitment to helping sick kids and their families; through events, corporate volunteering, community fundraising, donations and workplace giving initiatives. Their teams went above and beyond with their in-store fundraising topping \$281,000. The sale of Helping Hearts contributed \$116,000 to the total while the Charity Bikes brought in \$143,000. Macca's teams also came together to test their limits for a cause at Raw Challenge raising \$14,000. Their support goes a long way towards helping families have access to the support and care they need in our programs local to their restaurants.
