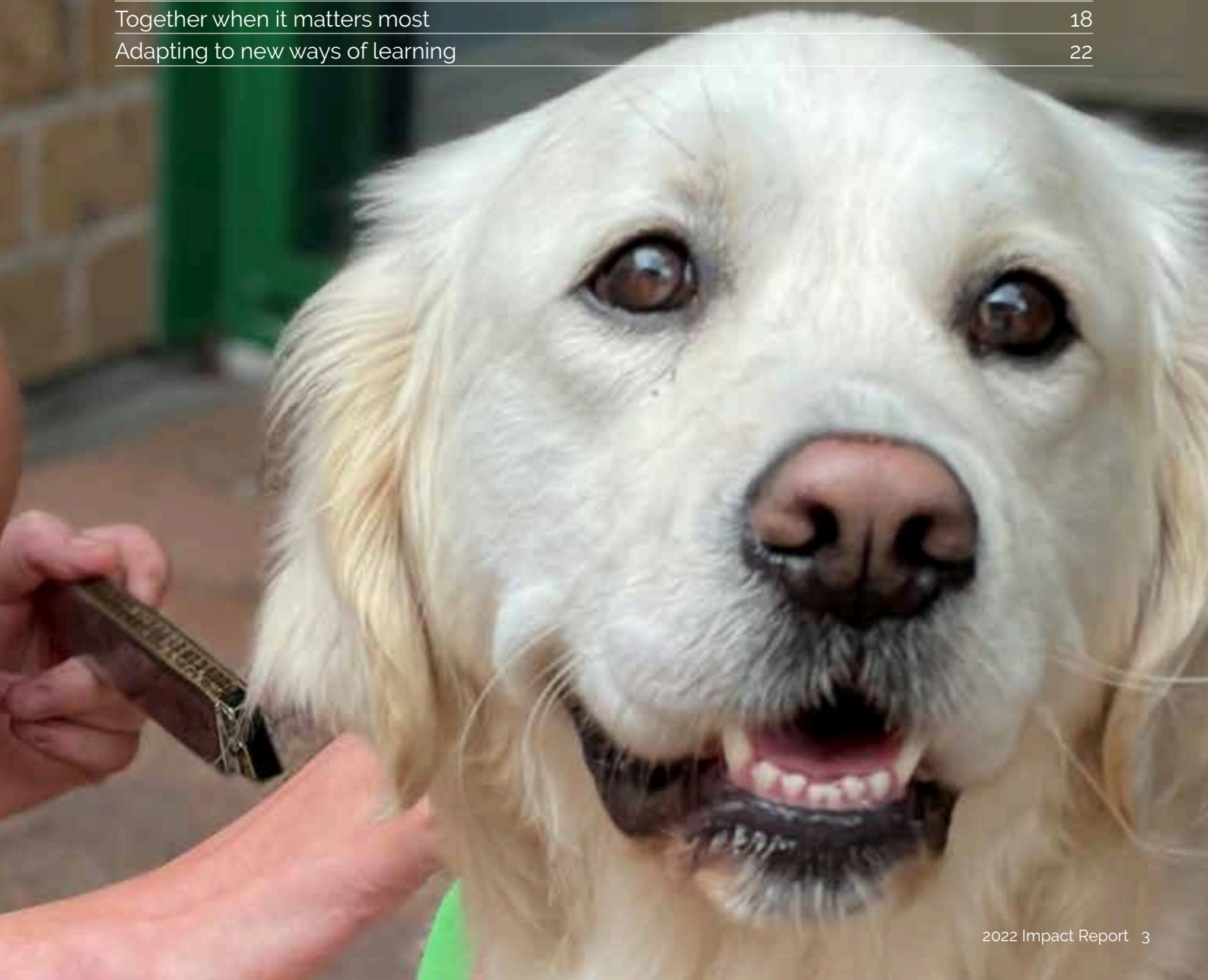

Our staff and volunteers help ease their burden, giving them practical and compassionate support so they can focus on what matters most.

The last few years have given us all an insight into how easily life can be thrown upside down. While most of us are moving forward towards a new COVID-19 normal, our families continue to face multiple challenges as they care for their seriously ill or injured children.

Thankfully, we continue to be there with them every step of the way.

We couldn't do this without our committed community of supporters. This includes our amazing volunteers, generous donors, corporate partners and our founding mission partner, McDonald's. Your support is vital to our mission of helping the families of seriously ill children across Northern NSW.

Together, we've helped 2,251 individual families in 2022 to stay together; access vital services; and benefit from our dedicated programs. This has made the lives of these families a little easier during difficult times.

2022 heralded new upgrades to our Ronald McDonald Houses in both Newcastle and Tamworth. The continuing refurbishment of our self-contained units in Newcastle and updates to bathrooms and the external facade in Tamworth are creating amazing new spaces for our families.

Our Family Rooms across the region operated at reduced hours in 2022 but continued to provide vital support to families in hospitals with seriously ill or injured children. A volunteer drive and updates to our NICU Family Room ensure families have a welcoming place to rest and recharge.

The much-loved Family Retreat at Forster has also had a makeover. Updated decking, painting and kitchens now offer families more home comforts as they enjoy the chance to relax together, far away from the stress of serious illness and invasive treatments.

Flexible online and in-person delivery of our Learning Program helped us support more students across Northern NSW in 2022. New initiatives for siblings and pre-schoolers reassured families that their kids are not missing out on learning while away from home.

Without our caring community who generously give their time and funding, Ronald McDonald House Charities, Northern NSW could not keep delivering these vital programs to our families. We are grateful to our volunteers, local businesses and all our donors for supporting our mission so wholeheartedly.

Thank you for standing beside us and sharing our vision to provide vital support to families by reducing the impact of their child's serious injury or illness.

About Us

When a child is seriously ill, it can disrupt every aspect of family life – from school and work, to everyday moments like meal times, bath times, play times and quality time. This can have a devastating effect on the whole family. Ronald McDonald House Charities® Northern NSW helps family life carry on while a child is undergoing treatment. Since 1991, we've helped thousands of families through their most difficult times.

Our Mission

To support the ever-changing needs of seriously ill children and their families.

Our Vision

To achieve the best outcome for families by reducing the impact of their child's serious illness.



How We Help

For over 30 years, we have been helping families who need our support. During that time, we've developed vital programs to help them enjoy more everyday family moments, right when they need them most.



2 Houses

Our Houses offer families a place to stay close to the hospital. They are especially helpful for families who have to travel far to receive treatment for their children. Each House's accommodation is equipped with everything families need to feel supported during their stay.



1 Family Retreat

Our Family Retreat gives families a chance to forget the stresses of hospital life. It's open to families with a seriously ill child, or those grieving the loss of a child.



3 Family Rooms

Our Family Rooms are located inside the hospitals and close to the children's wards. They give families a chance to recharge after many stressful hours at their child's side. Each Family Room is equipped with areas to rest, eat, freshen up, play, and relax.



Learning Program

Extended stays in hospital or receiving medical treatment means kids miss school. Our tailored one-to-one tuition helps kids catch up on schoolwork so that they feel confident as they transition back to school.

Our Learning Program also offers professional development for educators. EDMed™ provides teachers with information about the potential impacts of a serious or chronic illness, as well as educational strategies to support the needs of these students impacted by a serious or chronic illness.



A place to call home

“We had very little with us after having to abandon our lives so abruptly, but Ronald McDonald House provided us with the things we required to survive comfortably.”

When 3-month-old Weston was rushed from Inverell to John Hunter Children’s Hospital for immediate treatment in October 2021, the life of his family was thrown into turmoil. One day they were living their lives in the NSW Northern Tablelands - the next they were on a plane to NSW’s second biggest city, Newcastle.

“Weston was diagnosed with an incredibly rare disease and blood disorder,” his mother, Tara explains. “We initially lived out of the Paediatric Intensive Care Unit until we were offered a room at Ronald McDonald House Newcastle.”

During their 163-night stay, Tara, her husband Will and their children, Poppy and Hunter found a new normal while Weston underwent treatment. “It really was a home away from home for us, allowing us to focus on what mattered most - Weston’s recovery.”

Since leaving Ronald McDonald House Newcastle in March 2022, Weston has received a bone marrow transplant from his older brother, Hunter. With another long stint at Sydney’s Westmead Hospital, the family has once again received vital assistance from RMHC.

“So far, we’ve spent over 240 days away from home,” Tara says. “Weston is our little warrior. Although we have a long road ahead with lifetime challenges, we’ve been given the best possible start and the greatest support along the way.”

1,708 different families took a much needed break in one of our 3 Family Rooms, walking through our doors **5,082** times.

Ronald McDonald Family Retreat



112 holidays were provided for families at our Forster Retreat.

Ronald McDonald Learning Program



137 students received tutoring through the Learning Program. Our Education Liaison Officer worked closely with the Paediatric Oncology team to **support 75 students and their families** on their journey to recovery from serious illness.

Financial Highlights

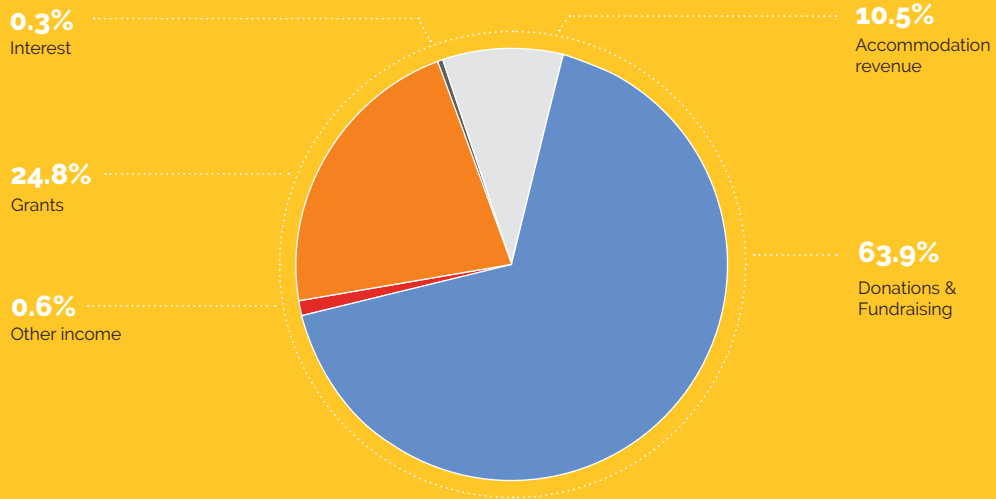
During 2022, RMHC Northern NSW generated nearly \$4.3 million to support the needs of seriously ill children and their families.

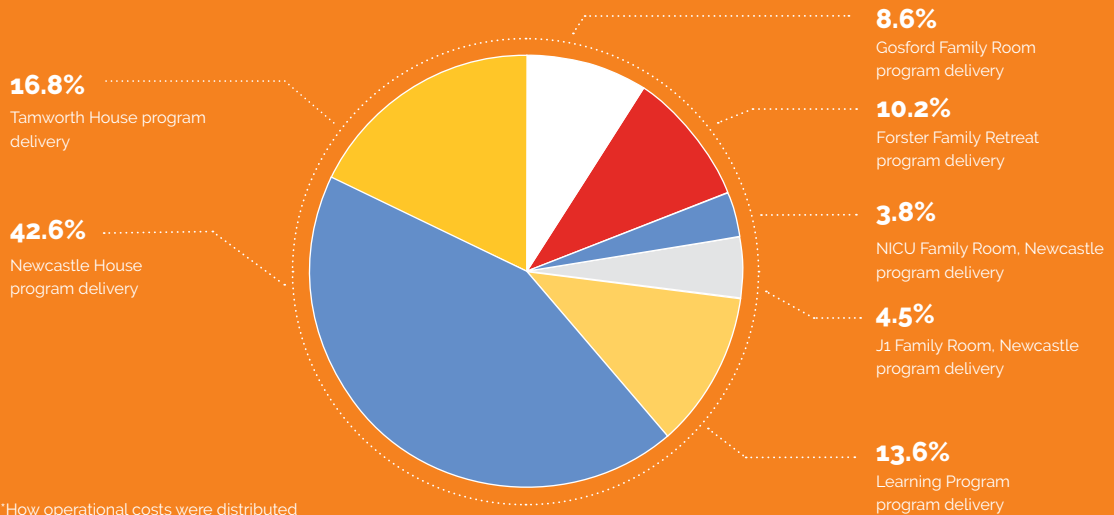
RMHC Northern NSW is 100% community owned and operated. We rely on community assistance to help us support the needs of seriously ill children and their families.

Where the money came from

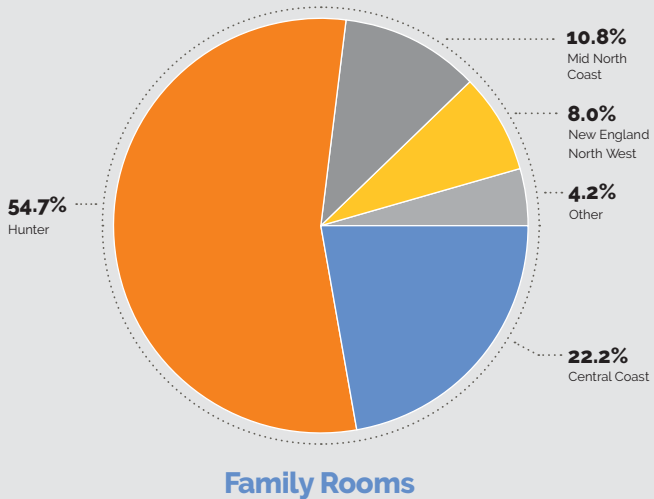


Where the money helped*

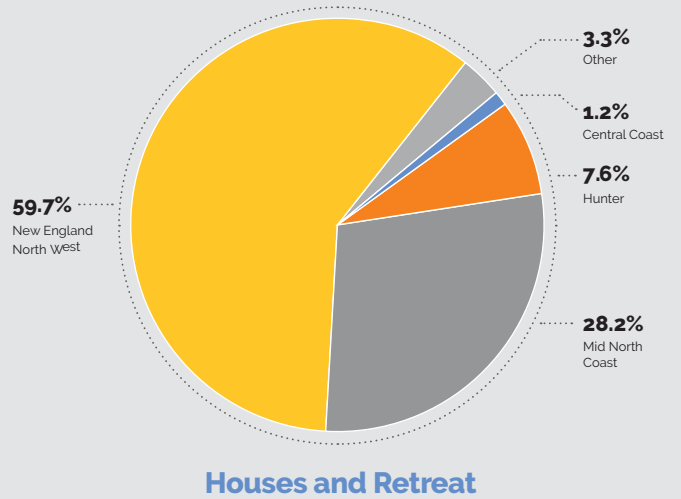


*How operational costs were distributed

A chance to make new memories

“What better time for the kids and I to reconnect and try to forget about the trials of the last few years than with a trip to Forster. We feel so blessed!”

A trip to the beach always seemed out of reach for 10-year-old Aria, her mum Bryana and brother Ben. Diagnosed with a serious autoimmune condition linked to sun exposure, Aria has spent years in and out of hospital.

“We’ve accessed both the Ronald McDonald Family Room and Ronald McDonald House at the John Hunter Children’s Hospital many times over the last decade – it’s been a long road” Bryana explains.

A long-awaited stay at the Family Retreat in Forster gave the family a much-needed opportunity to enjoy time away from ongoing treatment. It allowed them to make wonderful new memories by the beach – including a special birthday celebration for Aria.

“We had breakfast on the verandah as we opened presents,” Bryana continues. “We then enjoyed a dolphin-watching cruise before having Maccas for lunch, cupcakes for afternoon tea and Italian for dinner.”

Other highlights of their trip include exploring the break wall, swimming with wild dolphins, lots of ice cream and a visit to Forster Arts and Craft Centre, where Aria and Ben were gifted a gorgeous handmade quilt and crocheted blanket each.

While Aria’s treatment is ongoing, Bryana is grateful for the opportunity to rest and relax at the Family Retreat. “The magic created by Ronald McDonald House Charities is phenomenal and we’ve been so lucky to have experienced it!”

Bringing RMHC Northern NSW's Vision to Life

Our dedicated volunteers are the heart of our programs and make our vision - to reduce the impact of serious illness on families possible. Always ready to provide reassurance and assistance, each of our 235 volunteers plays a crucial role in supporting families through one of the most difficult times of their lives.

We cannot adequately express our gratitude to the generous souls who dedicate their time to ease some of the burden facing the families of seriously ill or injured children. From lending a compassionate ear to cooking meals and fundraising on our behalf, we thank all our volunteers from the bottom of our hearts.

A boost to our volunteer network

After COVID-19 restrictions depleted our volunteer network, we looked for new ways to boost volunteer numbers and raise morale. A collaboration with local indigenous artist Saretta Fielding created new inclusive uniforms for our volunteers, with Robson Civil Projects coming on board as our Volunteer Partner, contributing to funding the new uniforms and sponsoring a volunteer drive, in 2022.

Thoughtfully designed, the uniforms tell a beautiful story of Maroong - Good Place - with Saretta aiming "to evoke emotion and enhance connections to spirit and country." Representing RMHC NNSW through traditional symbolism and contemporary design, the wonderful new uniforms depict people, country and homes that reflect our network of programs.



Recognition for a local legend

Denise Robertson has a long association with RMHC NNSW. Many years ago, her grandson spent time at John Hunter Children's Hospital with diabetes, with her family benefitting from the support we provided. Denise was so appreciative of the help received that she vowed to volunteer as soon as a Ronald McDonald House was built in Tamworth.

True to her word, Denise started volunteering three days after Ronald McDonald House Tamworth opened its doors in 2008. For the last 14 years, Denise has given up her time to help families settle into their 'home away from home' as they care for their seriously ill children.

Recently named Volunteer of the Year (65+) at the Tamworth Local Legends Awards, Denise was "shaking" when she heard the news. Helping parents through the shock of a prolonged hospital stay, Denise focuses on "reassuring them that everything will be fine once their babies have grown up, and their children have got better."

Kara's Story in the Family Room

"The Family Room just felt like home. It was a place away from home where we could actually go and be a family, even if it was just for a short amount of time."

Born with serious health issues, by the time Kara turned 5, she had already been in hospital 26 times. Kara's parents, Simone and Scott, quickly came to rely on the help provided by Ronald McDonald House Charities.

"They provided us with a home away from home, where Mum and Dad could stay to help us care for our then 3-and-a-half-year-old daughter, Bria too," Simone explains.

A difficult time for the family, not only was Simone worried for Kara's health - she also worried for Bria's wellbeing.

"The Family Room at John Hunter Children's Hospital allowed us to keep our family together while protecting Bria from the buzzers and noises of Kara's room," Simone continues. *"It was a place to shower, wash clothes, and relax away from the ward."*

Now, 10 years old and in Year 5 at primary school, Kara's Heartkid beads tell the story of her long medical journey. *"I have 120 beads, with the big beads representing the big things and the small beads for the small things that have happened,"* she says.

Simone is in awe of her daughter's strength. *"Whether it has been poked and prodded, getting blood taken, having tubes taken out, being taken off a breathing machine - Kara is a pretty special kid and amazingly resilient."*

Our Community

Ronald McDonald House Charities Northern NSW is 100% community owned and operated. The continued support of businesses, community groups and individuals is key to helping families stay together while their seriously ill children receive vital treatment. Every contribution, big and small, makes a huge difference in the lives of families and helps bring our communities closer together.

Greater Charitable Foundation

Our 3 year partnership with the Greater Charitable Foundation, proves we are stronger together. Generous funding from the Greater Bank saved our families over \$443,000 in 2022, helping to ease the financial burdens that face families with sick children.



Enabled 80 families to stay close to their children at a Ronald McDonald House, totalling 800 nights - saving \$92,000.



Funded 1,500 family visits to our specially designed Ronald McDonald Family Rooms - saving \$159,000.



Allowed 40 families to enjoy a free beach holiday at the Ronald McDonald Family Retreat - saving \$120,000.



Provided 600 hours of tutoring to assist 15 students through the Ronald McDonald Learning Program - saving \$72,225.

Since 2015, Club Taree's signature fundraising and community engagement event, 'le Tour de Taree', has raised over \$300,000 for RMHC Northern

NSW. With a record \$72,351 raised in 2022, this initiative has made a big difference for Mid-North Coast families and has become a much-loved event for the greater Taree community.

Adapting to new ways of learning

“The Learning Program is amazing. Tahlea's tutor has connected with her, brought out the best in her and changed her mindset to instil a can-do attitude.”

When Tahlea began experiencing vision issues towards the end of Year 3, her parents, Nicole and Michael, had no inkling of the health journey they were about to take.

After seeing an optometrist for glasses in Term 4, Nicole noticed Tahlea's vision worsening over the Christmas holidays as she held more things close to her face to see.

After being referred to an ophthalmologist, they learned Tahlea had keratoconus – a condition where a thinning of the cornea leads to visual distortion, affecting visual acuity.

“Within three months, Tahlea's condition progressed from 0 to advanced, leaving her legally blind,” Nicole recounts. After initial treatments failed, she underwent two double cornea transplants, seriously impacting her learning.

After hearing about the Ronald McDonald Learning Program, Nicole initially believed there were other families who needed the support more. Encouraged by a friend, she contacted the Learning Program and Tahlea hasn't looked back since.

Helping Tahlea catch up on her missed schooling, the Learning Program has also helped build her confidence and shown her what she can do, whatever the challenges ahead.

“I can't thank them enough,” Nicole says, *“it is life-changing for families and kids to know that they have that support. When you spend so much time working out what is best for the child the other stuff tends to get forgotten. It all helps so much.”*

Our Programs



Highlights from 2022

Houses

2022 saw the start of much-needed renovation projects for our two Ronald McDonald Houses in Newcastle and Tamworth.

Ronald McDonald House Tamworth is benefitting from upgrades to bathrooms and to the external facade of the building. These improvements are making the house a more welcoming place for families while improving access to vital amenities.

The renovation of our self-contained units at Ronald McDonald House Newcastle continued thanks to a Wests Group Grant. This project is giving families a more comfortable place to stay right next to John Hunter Children's Hospital.

Family Rooms

Our Family Rooms operated under reduced hours during 2022, but a volunteer drive helped us still be there to ease the burden of hundreds of families caring for an injured or ill child.

A generous donation from Nova Alliance Bank allowed new lounges to be installed in the NICU Family Room at the John Hunter Hospital. Providing a comfortable place to rest after hours at their child's side, this addition has been much appreciated.

As one family shared, "The Family Room has been a blessing in an uneasy and uncertain time, whilst being away from home. The volunteers are lovely and always able to help or even just have a yarn. We've greatly appreciated it all."



Forster Retreat

Our Forster Family Retreat underwent renovation in 2022, upgrading decking, painting, and kitchens.

Thanks to the generosity of the local community, these upgrades have transformed the cabins at the Retreat into a modern beach house with all the amenities families need to enjoy quality time together.

Providing an escape from the stress and worry of the hospital, our Forster Family Retreat is a place by the beach where families can rest, relax, and recharge. These upgrades ensure that more families can benefit from much-needed time away in a peaceful coastal location.

Learning Program

As we find a new normal following the end of COVID-19 restrictions, our Learning Program continues to help seriously ill or injured children stay engaged with learning.

A flexible approach that combines online learning with face-to-face support saw 137 students engage in our Learning Program in 2022. Another 75 students were supported through our Ed Liaison scheme with their local schools.

2022 saw the launch of our new siblings' pilot to help siblings of seriously ill children access a range of specially developed learning programs. We also developed a dedicated preschool program for younger children and offered an updated in-house school holiday program.



Teaming with purpose

Each year, teams of people put their heart and soul into helping us provide holistic support to families with a seriously ill or injured child.

What makes a House a home? Comfort, safety, laughter, a nourishing meal and love, with lots of precious moments in between. Those nourishing meals are served up as part of Meals from the Heart, alleviating families of the burden of preparing dinner after a physical and emotionally draining day at the hospital.

This year 58 groups signed up so that families could return to a lively kitchen and a healthy and hot meal, tasty treats of baked goods or delicious homestyle breakfast awaiting them, served with love and smiles.

“Our teams love coming to the House and making a meal for the families and hearing their stories. Knowing how much of an impact the simple task of making a meal for someone has makes it so worthwhile.”
