It's been over 30 incredible years of helping families since Newcastle House opened in April 1991. Over these three decades, 81,631 families have received critical support through our programs. This milestone is only made possible by the support of our generous community and the dedicated volunteers who are the beating heart of our programs.

We send our sincere heartfelt thanks to each of the 3,304 donors in 2021. Because of your compassion and commitment to our community, last year almost 2,000 families received support in their time of need.

While COVID-19 restrictions continued to impact our services, we are so grateful that you stood with us. Sadly, restrictions forced us to close Family Rooms and other communal areas, along with the Family Retreat, and we had to say goodbye to many of our dedicated volunteers.

Now as many of our programs are returning to face-to-face, we are working to rebuild a strong volunteer base across the region.

Your support has helped us continue to deliver our mission through the last year, providing families with the vital support they needed at every step of the way. The Learning Program returned to face-to-face learning, giving critical support to children and their siblings.

You also helped provide vital infrastructure projects with refurbishments and new indoor and outdoor furniture. All these

improvements provide families with the comfort they need and a place to call home, often for many months.

Your generosity also allowed us to renovate bathrooms, ramps and roofs at the Family Retreat, to give families a better experience when they escape for a much-needed break.

It's been incredible to see the overwhelming support as we resumed our major fundraising events with the Raise Love Charity Ball and our popular golf days.

We are so grateful to sponsors and committed participants who joined Ride for Sick Kids and rode solo in their local LGA's. This event had a record year, raising over \$250,000 and we are truly thankful.

Together, we have been through many changes and disruptions during 2021, but our dedication to families who are going through some of the toughest days of their lives has remained steadfast.

We are incredibly thankful to our supporters and volunteers, old and new, who share our compassion for helping families, as much today as 30 years ago.

When a child is seriously ill, it can disrupt every aspect of family life – from school and work, to everyday moments like meal times, bath times, play times and quality time. This can have a devastating effect on the whole family. Ronald McDonald House Charities helps family life carry on while a child is undergoing treatment. Since 1981, we've helped thousands of Australian families through their most difficult times.

Our Mission

To support the ever-changing needs of seriously ill children and their families.

Our Vision

To achieve the best outcome for families by reducing the impact of their child's serious illness.



How We Help

For 30 years, we have been helping families who need our support. Over that time, we've developed vital programs to help them enjoy more everyday family moments, right when they need them most.



2 Houses

Our Houses offer families a place to stay close to the hospital. They are especially helpful for families who have to travel far to receive treatment for their child. Each House's accommodation is equipped with everything families need to feel supported during their stay.



3 Family Rooms

Our Family Rooms are located inside the hospitals and close to the children's wards. They give families a chance to recharge after many stressful hours at their child's side. Each Family Room is equipped with areas to rest, eat, freshen up, play and relax.



1 Family Retreat

Our Family Retreat gives families a chance to forget the stresses of hospital life. They're open to families with a seriously ill child, or those grieving the loss of a child.



Learning Program

Extended stays in hospital or receiving medical treatment means kids miss school. Our tailored one-to-one tuition helps kids catch up on school work so that they feel confident as they transition back to school.

Our Learning Program also offers professional development for educators. EDMed™ provides teachers with information about the potential impacts of a serious or chronic illness, as well as educational strategies to support the needs of these students impacted by a serious or chronic illness.

Leanne & Ben



30 years of helping families

"Ronald McDonald House Charities provide more than just a house, they are part of our family. The house became our family's home for many years. They helped us with everything."

For 30 years, Newcastle House has been a home away from home for more than 80,000 unique families. Most families arrive heart broken, overwhelmed, and steeped with worry about the uncertainties ahead for their sick children.

Through the work of dedicated staff and volunteers, and the care and support from other families facing the same experiences, they find a place to call home at Newcastle House. Here they found a place that helps them with everything they need, during some of the hardest times of their lives.

Parents Leanne and Mitch were sleeping in the hallway of John Hunter Children's Hospital to be close to their son Ben (two years old at the time) who had been diagnosed with a brain tumour.

Ben was on life support and the family were given the tragic news that he would only have 12 months to live. They were forced to leave their home with Ben's

siblings, three hours away to be close to specialised medical care for Ben.

"We had to approach Ben's medical care and the challenges that came with it as a family unit to give Ben every possible chance of surviving his serious illness," Leanne shared.

The Newcastle House provided a haven so the family could stay together and it has continued throughout Ben's life during their regular hospital visits.

"Ronald McDonald House came through like family. They supported us when we needed it the most. We will never forget that," Leanne told us.

In 2021 Ben celebrated his 30th Birthday, just like us.



Georgia



Georgia and Family

Georgia was three years old when she was diagnosed with Acute Lymphoblastic Leukaemia and only given three months to live.

Life was turned upside down for her parents Helena and Wayne and their two older children. Living almost 300km's away from the hospital, they were determined to always be by Georgia's side.

Ronald McDonald House Newcastle became their family's home while Georgia received treatment for 251 days. Thankfully, the treatment was successful and Georgia made a full recovery.

"The Newcastle House is full of people with hearts of gold. They are angels on earth to help those in need during a time of stress," said Helena.

The bonds formed with Ronald McDonald House volunteers, staff and other families has been unbreakable for Georgia's family. They have been holidaying with

another family from the house every year for 10 years now.

Now 16, Georgia shared with us how the support received from RMHC and the friendships they formed at Newcastle House has been life-changing for her entire family.

"Ronald McDonald House Charities changed our lives. It gave us a different outlook on life and has helped us be the family we are today. A family full of love, strength, compassion and appreciation - the same values RMHC has."

With our dedicated supporters over the last three decades, Newcastle House has been helping keep families together, during the most challenging times of their lives. It's all thanks to our compassionate and caring community that we have been there, and can continue to be there, for the many more families who will walk through our doors.

The impact you made in 2021

Unique Families Supported

Almost **2,000** families were helped by staff, volunteers and supporters in 2021.



Ronald McDonald Houses

373 different families given a home away from home for a total of **5,832 nights**. **\$1,265** were saved per family during an average stay of **11 nights** on accommodation, parking, food, and laundry.

While COVID-19 limited our volunteers ability to be in the Programs, we still had many volunteers passionate about the mission and connected to the cause.





Ronald McDonald Family Rooms

1,162 families took a much needed break in one of our 3 Family Rooms, walking through our doors **6,240** times. Saving an average **\$106** per family.



Ronald McDonald Family Retreat


87 holidays were provided for families at our Forster Retreat saving families an average of **\$3,000** per holiday.



Ronald McDonald Learning Program

131 students received tutoring through the Learning Program. Our Education Liaison Officer worked closely with the Paediatric Oncology team to support **49 students and their families** on their journey to recovery from serious illness. This was a maximum savings for parents of **\$4,815**.





Financials

RMHC Northern NSW generated over \$4 Million in 2021 to support seriously ill children and their families.

These vital funds have helped almost 2,000 families in our region get the support and care they needed to help them through the most difficult times.


Our fundraising income has returned to levels that we achieved before COVID-19 restrictions, making a substantial impact of \$2,286,722.

RMHC NNSW is 100% community owned and operated. We rely on the generosity of the community to help us provide support to sick children and their families through our vital programs.


In 2021 the extensive support from local businesses across the region resulted in a 60% increase.

Where the money came from




Where the money helped*

Help is Always There

When Ronald McDonald House Newcastle reached out to Shenayd and Kajeel to offer them a room at the Newcastle House it saved them! "We had no idea where we were going to go, we were so happy that we could keep our family together," Shenayd shared.

Levi was born extremely premature, at 24 weeks. He was flown by helicopter from Gosford Hospital to John Hunter Children's Hospital where he began a long stay that lasted 117 days.

Shenayd, her husband, Kajeel and their 2 year old son Jakari had to leave their home on the Central Coast, and go to Newcastle to be with Levi.

"We just arrived with nowhere to go, nowhere to stay, but we needed to be with Levi," Shenayd said.

Shenayd and Kajeel found complete peace of mind staying at the Newcastle House. It gave them the opportunity to be with their new baby in hospital, but also spend time with their other son, who needed his parents.

Today, Levi is home with his family and meeting his childhood milestones. Shenayd and Kajeel are so incredibly happy with their beautiful family.

"My family was in such great need and it's thanks to the incredible community and kind supporters that helped us get through it. We didn't know what to expect or how to be prepared for what was around the corner, but having Ronald McDonald House Newcastle there to help prepare us was a lifesaver," Shenayd shared.



Volunteers

Dedicated to helping families

Margaret has been passionately involved with the Newcastle House from the very beginning. She is a founding committee member, former Board Member for RMHC Northern NSW and a dedicated volunteer.

In fact, Margaret has been volunteering since Newcastle House first opened its doors in 1991. She will be the first to tell you how supportive and inspiring the community around her was, right from the start.

"I received more from volunteering than I put in," said Margaret. "To help take the anxiety and stress away from families with seriously ill children by making the house a home away from home was incredibly rewarding. The volunteers were the heart

of the house," she said.

It was only just recently that Margaret stopped volunteering at the house when COVID-19 restrictions were introduced, after dedicating herself to helping families for 30 years.

Margaret has so many happy memories of the house, but one in particular that she recalls was the absolute joy on a new mother's face when after five months, she was able to take her premature baby home. She had been living at the house the entire time while her baby grew stronger in the hospital. "That memory will stick with me forever," said Margaret.



Kim - Helping ease their burden

Kim volunteers at the Family Retreat in Forster to help families that have had a tough time spend some quality time together.

"Having a sick or injured child is extremely stressful so having somewhere they can visit for a

short break, or a holiday is terrific," Kim said.

"Helping sick kids and their families enjoy some rest and relaxation as part of their recovery is a very worthy cause, so I'd encourage anyone in the area to come and join us as a volunteer."



Deanna - Helping families take a break

Deanna volunteers in the Family Room at Gosford Hospital where she enjoys making a challenging situation a little less stressful for families.

"The Family Room is a haven for the patients and their families to get

away from the ward or treatment rooms and have a bit of a break," Deanna said.

"It's a great feeling to know you've helped someone who's having a tough time and I would recommend it to anyone looking to give something back to their community."

Ronald McDonald House Tamworth volunteer, Sue, said it's great to give back to the community.

"Ronald McDonald House does a wonderful job supporting people going through a tough time," Sue said.

Time to Reconnect

“We are thankful to have been able to stay at this beautiful, peaceful place and to spend quality time together. We can't wait to come back!”

The past two years have been incredibly challenging for parents Alicia and Sean. Having the opportunity to spend some quality family time together at the Family Retreat in Forster was a time for them to relax and recharge.

Their two-year-old son, Henley was diagnosed with a rare genetic disorder in 2020 and they had to pack up their lives and move five hours from their home so Henley could get life-saving treatment.

Their family endured months of isolation with Henley and frightening times in Intensive Care when Henley's treatment caused difficult side effects.

“We have faced a lot of trauma and grief over the past two years, so having the chance to be together as a family and reconnect was a welcoming experience,” said Alicia.

Staying at the Family Retreat allowed Alicia, Sean and the children to extend their time on holiday, giving them the chance to unwind and relax as a family.

They spent days at the beach and were even able to hire a boat, which was the highlight of their trip.

After the financial burden of relocating for Henley's treatment and the gruelling stress of seeing their son so ill, the Family Retreat was the perfect place for Alicia, Sean, Henley and his brother Darcy to relax together.

The family are looking forward to taking a much needed break again at the retreat before Henley has more extensive treatments towards the end of the year.

A Love for Learning

19-year-old Jacob is completing his mechanic apprenticeship and hopes to one day own his own mechanic shop to help people experiencing hardship, keep their cars safely on the road.

Jacob was diagnosed with Acute Lymphoblastic Leukaemia when he was 11 years old and in Year 5 at school. During his treatment and recovery he was often unable to attend school, but with the support of the educators in the Learning Program, Jacob was able to receive tutoring to help him catch up.

During year 9, Jacob became seriously-ill again and his only chance of survival was a bone marrow transplant. After his transplant, Jacob continued his care under the team at John Hunter Children's Hospital and continued his study with the support of the Learning Program.

Despite missing almost four years of school, Jacob proudly completed his High School Certificate in 2019. It was an incredible achievement for Jacob because during the years he was sick, he started to believe that he was unable to start or finish anything.


With a passion for cars and mechanics, Jacob is studying an apprenticeship in mechanics and has incredible enthusiasm to work hard every day.

Jacob recently received a grant scholarship through the RMHC Charlie Bell Scholarship Program to help him purchase the tools required for his trade and he couldn't be more grateful.

"What RMHC does for families like mine is unbelievable. Thank you just never seems enough." said Jacob.

Thanks to the Greater Charitable Foundation funding over the last two years, the Learning Program have given sick children like Jacob, and their siblings, the support to catch up on school work, or additional educational help when needed. Major Highlights



Progressing the mission

Our mission is to ensure every family that receives care and support from RMHC Northern NSW has access to the best available services we have on offer. With the support of corporate partners and our extended community, we strive to ensure that accommodation and programs are upgraded and improved to meet increased demand and relieve the burdens on families.

Newcastle House unit refurbishment

After significant delays caused by two Covid-19 lockdowns and ongoing restrictions, the refurbishments of two family units were completed in November 2021 and has been occupied ever since, by families who need somewhere to stay.

The refurbishment included full upgrades to the kitchens and complete repainting of

the units to help provide a comfortable and relaxing space for families to be together. With the help of our community, each unit was also completed with new furniture and home decor to create a warm and inviting home away from home.

We are so grateful to Newcastle Permanent Charitable Foundation who funded this vital project.

We also want to extend our heartfelt thanks to Melony Lea of Melony Lea Designs for helping bring our vision for the units to life along with the many other in-kind donors.

To be able to come home to a modern, fresh, bright accommodation at the end of long and traumatic days at hospital has made such a difference in helping families cope.



Greater Partnerships. Stronger Together

The Greater Charitable Foundation and the Greater Bank have partnered with RMHC Northern NSW in a three year partnership, positively impacting on the lives of countless families. The partnership aims to ease the financial burden on families by giving them greater access to programs and support services. We are so grateful to the Greater Partnerships to help ensure we can continue to be there for families to help relieve their financial and emotional burdens.

Launching the House App

We have recently launched the House App that helps provide families with as much information as they need when they first arrive at the house. The App helps keep families updated and connected with programs and activities within the house, eliminating paperwork and forms at a time when they usually feel overwhelmed and confused.

Families have reported how easy it is to stay informed and access information. The App aims to give families the highest level of care and reduce their stress as much as possible.

Forster Family Retreat upgrades

Significant building upgrades have been completed at the Forster Family Retreat that will make holidays much more enjoyable for families. Tamworth House

A Place to Call Home

"The staff and volunteers at Ronald McDonald Newcastle House are 'life-savers'. They were my fill-in family who created a warm, loving, and caring place for Elizabeth and I to come home to every day." Sharon, Inverell, NSW.

When Sharon discovered her 14-month-old daughter Elizabeth had Acute Lymphoblastic Leukaemia, she was devastated. Sharon and Elizabeth lived five hours from John Hunter Children's Hospital and the rest of her family were all in Queensland. She had no family support close by.

"I felt like I was up a creek without a paddle," said Sharon.

Sharon stayed at the Newcastle House where she found support from volunteers and staff and was only minutes away from the hospital, so she could always be by Elizabeth's hospital bed.

She could access the Family Room at the hospital whenever she needed a break from the stresses of the hospital or just to have a quiet cup of tea alone.

"I appreciate having a safe place to go after a long day in hospital. Until you are in this situation, you don't realise the level of incredible support that the staff and volunteers at RMHC provide," Sharon said.

At the end of each day, Sharon was able to return to the House where she often had a caring listening ear or other families to share a meal with and talk to.

"I would be in an extremely difficult situation without Ronald McDonald House Charities. I will forever be indebted to them," said Sharon.
